

# Clarification of UCI Regulations on Rider Position in Time Trials – National Time Trial Championships

In advance of the upcoming National Time Trial Championships the Technical Working Group would like to remind all riders intending to ride the Championships of the changes to the UCI regulations for the 2023 season, for rider positioning in Time Trials.

## **Rider Height Verification**

For UCI Time Trials, if requesting a height exemption to the standard regulations, riders must have their height verified by their doctor and entered on the UCI online registration system. This is for all riders over 1.80m in height (without shoes and no helmet) should they wish to travel to a UCI Time Trial event.

Once you are verified on the UCI website – you can add the UCI sticker to your Time Trial bike to indicate what dimensions it will be measured against prior to starting a UCI Time Trial.

The rider's name is also checked against the UCI database to ensure compliance – so it is not just a matter of printing a label and putting it on your bike you need to be on the UCI list.





As not all riders from Ireland who require exemptions, are listed on the UCI website at this point in time – we will be completing height verification at the National Time Trial Championships on the 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2023.

As the process takes time and there are many additional processes to go through before the start of the Time Trial, the time for height verification time and location will be indicated during the week preceding the championships.

If a rider is not listed with the UCI or has not had their height verified within this set period, their bikes will be confirmed against UCI default measurements – UCI 1.3.023. As always riders on non-compliant bikes and with non-compliant positions will not be permitted to start the National Time Trial Championship.

#### **Confirmation of Riders Position UCI Regulations 2023**

Under regulation 1.3.023 – the default position for any rider is as follows (height category 1 <180cm)

Tip of Saddle Behind center bottom bracket

Furthest point on bars including gear levers 75cm forward from center bottom bracket

Height Difference forearm support/highest point 10cm

If the tip of the saddle is more than 5cm behind center bottom bracket – the forward reach can be extended to 80cm.

#### **Height Exemptions**

### Category 2

If a rider is confirmed as height category 2 >180.0cm and <189.9cm, they may have the following exemptions provided their saddle tip is 5cm behind center bottom bracket.

Furthest point on bars including all accessories 83cm forward from center bottom bracket


Height Difference forearm support/highest point 12cm

#### Category 3

If a rider is confirmed as height category 3 >190cm, they may have the following exemptions provided their saddle tip is 5cm behind center bottom bracket.


Furthest point on bars including gear levers 85cm forward from center bottom bracket

Height Difference forearm support/highest point 14cm




In line with these position changes – several other changes have been made.

Angle of inclination of forearm supports has been increased to <30 degrees



Front edge of forearm supports must be >180mm from furthest point of on bars including all accessories.
